THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Area Higher Education Updates

Representatives from each of the four institutions of higher learning were on hand Thursday to provide updates of program and campus developments. Katy Arrowood, CEO of Griffin Region College and Career Academy (GRCCA), reported that in their first year of operation they have 155 high school students who are dually enrolled in GRCCA and their local highs schools in Butts, Pike and Spalding counties and will earn 909 college credits. GRCCA was selected by the Lt. Governor's office for the German Apprenticeship System. She also reported that renovations continue with the former Spalding High School building that GRCCA will occupy. Randy Peters, President of Southern Crescent Technical College (SCTC), reported an enrollment of 4,697 students this fall which is down about 150 students from last year. Similar enrollment trends have been reported by all colleges located south of Interstate 20 in Georgia. Enrollment in SCTC's adult education program remains above the statewide average with 1600 enrolled full time and 3000 enrolled part-time. New program offerings at SCTC are an associate degree in nursing, water quality technician, apprentice linesman at the Flint River campus, and logistic management at the Henry County campus. An 82,000 sq ft building is in the design phase for housing the automotive mechanic and repair program on the Henry County campus, and renovations have begun at the Ellis Crossing facility in Griffin which may contain a conference center. Max Burns, President of Gordon State College, reported a slightly lower enrollment of approximately 4000 students this fall. He noted that Gordon has built working partnerships with others in the local area including the UGA Griffin Campus, SCTC, and GRCCA. Gordon's nursing program continues to excel, now offering RN and BSN degrees and their graduates being in demand by local hospitals and medical facilities. Gordon is also offering degree programs in biology and in Health Information Management. Kirk Kealey, Director of UGA's Food Processing and Innovation Center (Food PIC) reported his center's new building on the UGA Griffin Campus is nearing completion and will likely be occupied in early 2017. Pepsico has contracted the Center for possible collaborations, and Fritos-Lay has contracted to perform a product salt content test with the Center. The number of projects between industries or small businesses with the Center has tripled since this time last year. Construction of the Turfgrass Building on the UGA Griffin Campus is also progressing and should soon be enclosed to begin interior construction. Kealey explained that Lew Hunnicutt, Assistant Provost and Campus Director, announced continued renovation and development on the Campus to provide a more educational institutional atmosphere and design.
