# ROTARY: MAKING A DIFFERENCE

# THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Georgia Secretary of State

Brian Kemp spoke Thursday on his 8+ years serving as Georgia's Secretary of State. agency provides a number of services for Georgians including oversight of elections, tracking annual corporate filings, granting professional licenses, and overseeing the state's securities' market. Kemp reminded those in the audience that the period for annual corporate registration and filings will end April 1. He added that the process for filing has been revised with upgrades to the online platform. This improved process resulted in 3500 less calls to resolve problems with system which speeds processing time elsewhere in the department. He explained that Professional Licensing Division issues certifications to those individuals who have

satisfied the certification standards or respective professional Boards. He noted that 96-97% of those individuals who are now re-certifying, are doing so online. "For example," he said. "Of the 62,000 nurses who re-certified last year, only 200 did so by paper." Kemp attributed this increased efficiency to the restructuring of their IT Division. They are continuing to implement a 5-year plan that also includes replacement of hardwire and installation of fiberoptics. Kemp shared that the improved online capabilities also allow for online voter registration, online requests of absentee ballots by military and others overseas, and accessing your precinct information through the MyVoter portal on the website. He assured the audience that their Georgia voter records had not be hacked as mistakenly reported last year. In fact, the voter rolls are continually updated, their security monitored, and backed p every few minutes. While voting machines will soon need to be replaced with newer versions, Georgia voting machines are never connected to the internet and, therefore, not subject to hacking. The department does maintain the rolls and removes inactive voters only as mandated and prescribed by federal law. Kemp noted there were excellent voter turnouts in the 2016 presidential election and the special Congressional election last year. "Both of those elections made last year the busiest of my 8 years in office," he added.
