THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Georgia Farm Bureau



Cliff Bowden, District Federation Manager with the Georgia Farm Bureau, explained what many in the audience had been asking, "Just what does the Georgia Farm Bureau do?" Bowden oversees 17-county а including Spalding and his own native Meriwether counties. The GFB is the state's largest and strongest voluntary agricultural organization with almost 285,000 member Bowden attributes the strength of the GFB to its foundation at the local level with 158 of Georgia's counties having a local GFB office. And, although GFB may be best known for its insurance, the overall mission of GFB is to promote agriculture, and they do so at the local, district, state, and national levels. GFB began in 1939 when a group of 50 farmers in the Bartow County area formed an association

to promote agriculture. The insurance member service was added in 1959. About 94% of members have an insurance product with GFB. There are a number of other member services offered with the \$25 annual membership fee. The Certified Farm Market Program identifies products produced on farms meeting certain standards. The Ag In Class Program is an educational program that focuses on kids by sponsoring, among other programs, Farm Days and Farm Safety Days. The Women's Leadership Committee is one of the more active programs and is working hard on ag literacy. The Young Farmer Program is connecting those younger members for mutual support and mentoring. The Commodity Advisory Program is also an active program with 20 commodity committees. Local committees identify and prioritize their own local needs. These are promoted and supported locally but also melded with priorities from other counties in a district, and those from other districts to identify state priorities which are promoted and supported at that level. More recently, GFB added Identity Theft Consultation and Restoration as a member service. They also have established a Foundation for tax-exempt donations, and they have a banking system with credit cards, checking and money market accounts, and loans for equipment purchases. GFB member families are definitely getting a huge "bang for their buck" with that annual membership fee. But, as Bowden concluded, "The Georgia Farm Bureau has been in the business of the promotion of agriculture since 1937, and it always will be."
