THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Brand Updates on FODAC

Chris Brand, CEO of the nonprofit Friends of Disabled Adults and Children (FODAC), returned to our Club to update us on the continued efforts of the FODAC to keep people with injuries, illness, and disabilities moving and active. The mission and plan of FODAC is pretty simple - to provide refurbished home medical equipment (HME) and services at little to no cost to the All parts and equipment FODAC receives are donated, and almost all repairs and refurbishing is done by volunteers. Brand noted that FODAC provides over 5,000 HME items both locally and nationally each year. They also accept computers and laptops to refurbish to provide to disabled and low income individuals at low cost. FODAC operates out of a 65,000 square foot facility in Tucker, but they have donation, or drop-off sites, in 20 locations in the Atlanta area, including ones in Fayetteville (Freedom Medical) and Morrow (St. Vincent de Paul). They also have locations across Georgia.

Through their efforts, over 40,000 wheelchairs have been provided to those in need. The estimated retail value of all medical equipment FODAC has provided exceeds \$100 million. Brand added that FODAC is now providing disaster relief in partnership with FEMA and local nonprofits and providers in disaster-stricken areas. They first assisted in relief efforts following Katrina. More recently, they provided relief following Harvey, Irma, and Maria. They work with local HME providers who have been identified by FEMA. Brand said that they quickly learned that there are no HME providers in either Puerto Rico or the Virgin Islands. Brand welcomes and actively develops partnerships to advance the cause of FODAC. Over 250 organizations now partner with FODAC. Many are Rotary clubs in our own District 6900. In fact, Chris is a member of the Stone Mountain Club where he served as President. He was recognized as the District 6900 Rotarian of the Year in 2017. He invited all to their fundraising events held three times each year - a Run, Walk & Roll in the spring, a Fall Golf Classic, and Breakfast with Santa in December. He explained that there are a number of ways in which individuals and groups can help the effort at Those include hosting equipment drives or drop-offs, increasing awareness of reuse of equipment, and connect those in need with FODAC.
