THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Hollberg on the City of Griffin



Doug Hollberg, current chair of the City Commission, updated Rotarians and our guests on the state of our City. Hollberg is serving his third stint as chair of the Commission and wholeheartedly endorsed a change in the city charter which will make the at-large commissioner position as that of mayor. That vote will be May 22nd. He shared that much progress has been made in three areas of, what he calls, leadership principles: financial accountability, economic development, and a safer community. The City now operates in the black with an annual budget of \$110 million. The city, county, and the Development Authority are working in concert to bring more business to the community. The city has focused on improving infrastructure and providing services that will attract and support economic growth. And, Hollberg noted that our crime rate has declined and that Griffin is, and continually works to be a safe and wholesome community in which to live, learn, work, play, and

retire. To these ends, the Commission identified three areas on which to focus: reduction or elimination of substandard housing, active code enforcement to insure neighborhoods are attractive and safe, and continued reduction of crime rate. He concluded his comments by listing several challenges and opportunities for the community: (1) resolution of Plant Vogtle troubles with funding, contractors, and construction delays; (2) city employee hiring and retention; (3) improved school system; (4) needed funding for transportation needs; (5) replacement of the Harry Simmons water treatment facility; (6) continued progress with the airport development which soon enter phase 2.
