THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Bert's BIG Adventure

Program co-Chair Katy Arrowood introduced our speakers saying that the program could be a "tear jerker". Katy pointed out that she was wearing gold to show her support Team Lake and the ongoing battle to end childhood cancer. Stacey Weiss, cofounder of the non-profit charity Bert's Big Adventure, explained that their concept is to bring together families whose children suffer from chronic or terminal illnesses. "Families often say that they feel alone," she said. "Bert's Big Adventure allows them to form bonds, friendships, and lasting relationships." Fifteen families are selected to participate each year. The high point of the year-long adventure is a trip to Disney World in Orlando each February. But, the adventure is far more than that trip. The nonprofit hosts four reunions each year to allow previous participants to come together in a large group again. And, Fairy Grandparents volunteer to help with hospitalized children where they read, play games, and spend time with the children. sometimes gives families time to take care of other matters. Weiss said that hope is a very powerful force, and that Bert's Big Adventure is trying to provide that magic for these children and their Families who have been part of the Adventure say that they support each other, do not feel alone anymore, feel connected with others, and definitely have hope. Anna Bozeman-Thompson, whose son Lake was an Adventure member, shared that Lake was not able to make the Disney World trip because of his illness. But, the families on the trip regularly Facetimed with Lake and his family during the trip to remain connected. Bert's Big Adventure arranged for Lake to meet the Atlanta Hawks. He even signed a one-day contract to play in the NBA with the Hawks. "I got to see my son's dreams come true, thanks to Bert's Big Adventure," she said. Lake passed away on May 1, 2015, due to acute leukemia. In referring to Bert's Big Adventure, Ms. Bozeman-Thompson said, "They will never know what they mean to our family and other families. They touched our family so very much. And, we are only a small part of who they touch." Weiss said that the nonprofit originated in Atlanta but has since spread to six cities in the U.S. She added that they are a 501(c) nonprofit and welcome any and all donations and support.
