THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM The State of the Local School System



Jim Smith, Superintendent of the Griffin-Spalding School System, provided an update on the State of the School System. Smith noted that the system is in an "era of change" and is working to address the changes that have occurred in the ways that students learn now. "Finding facts is not hard," he said. "But, teaching students how to use those facts to solve problems is our challenge." The system has developed and adopted new vision and mission statements that are focused on the system being an 'agent of change' in developing graduates who are "We basically want to future 'ready learners'. empower our students with talents to graduate college and be career ready," Smith added. A new strategic plan has been implemented that involves student performance, accountability, curriculum assessment

and development, development of staff, and continued collaboration with the community and community-support groups. "We really appreciate the work and energy our staff is doing and the support that this community provides," he said. Various task forces are working on several issues and objectives. One is addressing needs in alternative education to include those students who need some sort of flex-time study to allow them to continue to work while completing high school. Others simply perform better outside of the regular school environment. Another effort is examining ways to better prepare youngsters for pre-K and elementary programs. "We want to avoid kids being behind their grade level because once there, they usually stay behind," Smith said. A curriculum audit was recently performed to assist the system in insuring that they are addressing what is actually the system's curriculum objectives and to develop and implement assessment tools to better track performance and progress. Smith cited that graduation rates improved from 2014 to 2015 (2016 data are not yet available) and that SAT scores have increased. But, staff are continuing to address these issues as well as attendance rates. "We are exploring various incentives in keeping students in school," he said. Smith also noted that to address all of these educational issues, the system must align with the needs of our students, the way in which they now learn, and the community's goals. "Change is a very much important part of this process," he added. Smith concluded by saying that GSCS stands for more than Griffin-Spalding School System. It also stands for Grow, Sustain, Collaborate, and Succeed. "We cannot do what we have always done just because it has always been done that way," he added. "We must make changes to achieve results."


