Jahari McLean, the 11th grade winner, read her essay which centered on the theme of "one must be a follower before becoming a leader." The 10th grade winner was Alondra Garcia, and Kayla James was the 12th grade and overall school winner. She read her essay about overcoming adversity in her life. Kelly Smith recognized the Honorable Mention awardees from Spalding High as Cheyenne Landrum (9th), Emanuel Edwards (10th), William Godat (10th), Keylan Davis (11th), Taylor Morris (11th), Arinna Walker (12th) and Madelyn Carroll (12th). The overall grade winners were Lisa Fitzhugh (9th), Rebecca Haulk (10th), Gideon Bibbs (11th), and Jason Forrest (12th) who was also the school winner. Forrest read his essay using the quote, "Not about how strong we are, but what we can make from the rubble."

The Laws of Life contest in Georgia is the largest one in North America with over 45,000 essays written annually. Stephanie Windham, a board member of the Georgia Rotary District Character Education (GRDCEP), added that the Laws of Life program is a character education program for high school students in the state of Georgia. She stated that the program is supported by Rotary Clubs and individual Rotarians. Windham recognized members of the Griffin Daybreak Rotary Club who partnered with our Club to sponsor the Laws of Life Essay program in the two high schools. She also recognized all the students, parents, and school administrators who were attending. Windham announced that GRDCEP each year recognizes "Teachers of Distinction" and that Griffin High's Melanie Underwood and Spalding High's Kristin Smith received this honor for this school year.
