THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Remembering Those Who Died in Service to Our Country

"May we never forget freedom isn't free."

Philip Smith and Jim King organized and led an inspirational Memorial Day program honoring the 1.8 million men and women who have died in military service to our nation since 1775. Philip introduced Col. (US Army, ret.) Allan Imes who shared the history of and reading of the poem In Flanders Fields written by Lt. Col. John McCrae in 1915 on a WWI battlefield in Belgium (see below). Smith then explained that Memorial Day actually began following the Civil War, but after the end of WWI, it was changed to honor all those who died in service to our nation.

Bill Hardee narrated a video that honored and memorialized those who served and died in the Vietnam War. As Bill noted, the U.S. entered the Vietnam War very quietly in 1955. And, it ended with the fall of Saigon on April 30, 1975. In the intervening 19.5 years, over 9 million U.S. military served on active duty during the Vietnam War era. 240 of the 2.7 million who served in uniform in Vietnam were awarded the Medal of Honor, 58,220 were killed in action, and another 75,000 were severely wounded and disabled. Almost 2,000 Americans were imprisoned in 13 different prison camps as Prisoners of War (POWs) from

1964 to 1973. Most of those were airmen captured as their planes were shot down. In 1973, almost 2,500 servicemen were listed as Missing in Action (MIA). As of April 2017, 1,611 remained unaccounted for. Many serving in the jungles were repeatedly exposed to Agent Orange, a herbicide used to kill trees and foliage to eliminate refuge for enemy combatants. Cancer and birth defects among returning veterans have been linked to the herbicide. Bill also spoke about The Wall as the Vietnam War Veterans Memorial on the Mall in Washington, DC. The Wall captures the emotions of the human toll our servicemen and our country suffered during the Vietnam War era. It has helped heal the wounds - physical, psychological, social, and political. All Americans have come to appreciate and honor the sacrifices of those who served in Southeast Asia.

Jim King closed the program by inviting everyone to participate in the local Memorial Day ceremonies at Veterans Park on Memorial Drive on Monday at 11 AM. Jim added that there is one day on our calendar each year to remember those who died in service to our country, but there are 364 more days in the year on which we should also never forget those sacrifices.

In Flanders fields, the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place, and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved, and now we lie, In Flanders fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe: To you from failing hands we throw The torch; be yours to hold it high. If ye break faith with us who die We shall not sleep, though poppies grow In Flanders fields.

Col. (US Army, retired) Allan Imes was a special guest for our Memorial Day program. In reading this poem, Imes shared that the death of a good friend in combat is very painful and that the poem, In Flanders Fields, captures only part of those emotions.
