





Georgia and U.S. Experiencing Growth in Manufacturing

Roy Bowen, a fellow Rotarian (Atlanta Rotary) and current President of the Georgia Association of Manufacturers (GAM), shared that the GAM has advocated for Georgia manufacturers before the Georgia General Assembly, the Georgia Public Service Commission, and other state agencies since its inception in 1900. The GAM was originally the Georgia Textile Manufacturers Association. It shifted to its current scope of representing the interests of all manufacturers in the state in 2002-03, when Tom Gardner was serving in a leadership role with GAM. Throughout its history, the association has constantly worked to enhance the global competitiveness of Georgia manufacturers. As U.S. business interests shifted to technology-based and service-oriented enterprises, manufacturing in Georgia and the U.S. decreased. But, Bowen cited that manufacturing in Georgia and the U.S. has rebounded in recent years. "Manufacturing in Georgia has grown by 24% in the last six years," Bowen said. "This growth reflects the strength, quality, and diversity of Georgia manufacturers." GAM effectively builds relationships among its members and with policy and law makers to insure success. The diversity among its membership adds to GAM's strength in meeting and addressing the challenges experienced in growing manufacturing in our state. Bowen pointed out that recent legislative and regulatory successes have yielded over \$300 million in annual tax, energy, and other savings to Georgia manufacturers. "The future for manufacturing in Georgia is bright," he added. "Our state has an abundance of natural resources, the fastest growing port in the U.S., the busiest international airport in the country, and much more." Bowen predicts that manufacturing will continue to thrive. But, he hastily added that there are many challenges that must be addressed. He stated that preservation of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) involving the U.S., Mexico, and Canada is crucial to Georgia manufacturing and its continued growth and success. Bowen expressed concerns over announced trade tariffs with our trading partners (Note: Tariffs on goods from Mexico, Canada, and other partners were announced later in the day). Availability of an educated workforce could restrict further growth, Bowen noted. He feels that the University System of Georgia, the Technical College System, and the College and Career Academy program are helping to address these educational needs. The GAM is also providing scholarship support for those advancing their education and training in manufacturing. "Funding and developing new talent for new positions and for filling those positions created by retirements is very crucial," Bowen added.
