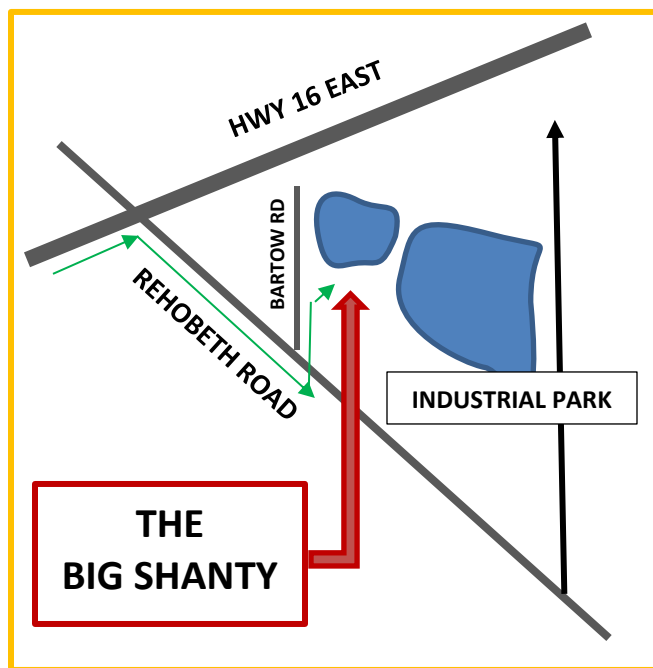
### BIG SHANTY ON OCTOBER 4<sup>TH</sup> GRILL YOUR OWN STEAK DINNER

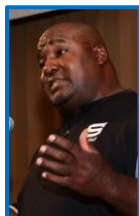

Nick Davis (SHS Football), Antonio Andrews (GHS Football), Brad Weber (PCHS Football), and Tykira Gilbert (SHS Girls Basketball) spoke to a common theme of building a culture of academic excellence, community service, leadership, and athletic performance among their student-athletes at their respective schools. Davis, in his 8<sup>th</sup> year at SHS, said that his team is currently 3-2 on the season and will be facing #2 Mary Persons this week. He recently switched to an option offense and relies on quickness, speed, and tenacity on defense. Andrews has also led his GHS Bears to 3-2 so far this season. The Bears face Starr's Mill this week, a team with a "high octane" offense. The strength of his defense is the line, while he feels that his offense is "close to being really good." Weber is in his 8<sup>th</sup> season at Pike County High. The Pirates are 4-0 on their season including a win over long-time rival Lamar County. The addition of a new stadium at PCHS has created lots of excitement for the school and the community. The Pirates also run an option offense focused on running and keeping possession of the ball. Gilbert's Lady Jags won the 4A basketball title last year in her 4<sup>th</sup> season as head coach. She proudly pointed to the GPA of 3.1 or higher that her players earned last year.
